

**Minutes of Pike Road Town Council Regular Meeting
Monday, April 14, 2025|6:00 PM
Pike Road Town Hall**

Mayor Stone called the meeting to order at 6:02 PM. Councilman Myers opened the meeting in prayer. Mayor Stone led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call: Council members present were Angie Bradsher, Chris Dunn, Doug Fuhrman, Chris Myers, and Rob Steindorff. A quorum was noted.

Consideration was given to the minutes for the regular meeting on March 26, 2025, and March 26, 2025, work session. Councilman Fuhrman made a motion to accept the minutes as presented, Councilman Myers seconded. Unanimous consent was given. The minutes were accepted as presented.

Reports

Planning

Chairperson of the Planning Commission, Chris Dunn, reported that the Planning Commission cancelled their meeting the previous week due to a lack of quorum.

Senior Planner, Darrell Rigsby, noted that Keith Covington recently experienced the death of his mother, which led to two items being pulled from the agenda but also that the meeting last week was cancelled due to a lack of quorum. Rigsby also noted that there should be an upcoming public meeting on the updated comprehensive plan in late May or early June. Rigsby and Mayor Stone also noted that they met with a Landscape Horticulturist earlier in the day that shared input to add a landscape maintenance component to the Comprehensive Plan Update.

Old Business

The only old business was discussion about when the inclusive playground would be completed. Town Clerk, Lisa Burke noted that the extended deadline was April 30, 2025, and then the fencing would have to be completed. We hope to open it in mid-May.

New Business

The first item of new business was **Resolution 004-2025-Disposal of Surplus Personal Property**. Town Clerk, Lisa Burke, noted that this was the outdated used telephone system that we could no longer find replacement parts for. Councilwoman Bradsher made a motion to accept **Resolution 004-2025-Disposal of Surplus Personal Property**. Councilman Myers seconded. The vote was unanimous. The resolution was approved. (**Resolution 004-2025-Disposal of Surplus Personal Property**)

The second item of new business was **Resolution 005-2025-Penn Meadows-Phase III-Street Lights**. Councilwoman Bradsher made a motion to accept **Resolution 005-2025-Penn Meadows-Phase III-Street Lights**. Councilman Dunn seconded. The vote was unanimous. The resolution was approved. (**Resolution 005-2025-Penn Meadows-Phase III-Street Lights**)

The last item of new business was **Resolution 006-2025-Appointment of School Board Member, Place 2**. Legal Counsel, Mark Williams, noted that he suggested they go into Executive Session since there could be discussion concerning the character of an applicant. Councilman Fuhrman made a motion to go into Executive Session. Councilman Steindorff seconded. The roll call vote was all yeas. They left at 6:12 and would return in 15 minutes.

The council returned at 6:30 and Councilwoman Bradsher made a motion to go back into the meeting. Councilman Fuhrman seconded. The vote was unanimous without a vote by Mayor Stone. Councilmembers cast their ballots that were counted by Town Clerk, Mark Williams, Lisa Burke, and Councilman Steindorff. Once the votes were tallied, Councilman Steindorff noted that it was a tie and there would be a second vote. Councilwoman Bradsher made a motion to go into Executive Session. Councilman Dunn seconded. The roll call vote was all yeas. They left at 6:39 and would return in 10 minutes. The council returned at 6:47 and Councilman Fuhrman made a motion to go back into the meeting. Councilman Myers seconded. The vote was unanimous without a vote by Mayor Stone. Councilmembers again cast their ballots that were counted by Town Clerk, Mark Williams, Lisa Burke, and Councilman Steindorff. Upon completion of the count, Councilman Steindorff made a motion to appoint Jeff Dickey to the Pike Road Board of Education, Place Two. Councilman Fuhrman seconded. The vote was unanimous without a vote by Mayor Stone. **(Resolution 06-2025)**

Other Business

There was no other business.

With no further business at hand, Councilwoman Bradsher made a motion to adjourn at 6:52 PM. Councilman Fuhrman seconded the motion. Unanimous consent was given. The meeting was adjourned.
