

Minutes of Pike Road Town Council Regular Meeting
Monday, August 10, 2026|6:00 PM

Mayor Stone called the meeting to order at 6:02 PM. Councilman Steindorff opened the meeting in prayer. Mayor Stone led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call: Council members present were Angie Bradsher, Doug Fuhrman, Rob Steindorff, Marcus Robinson, and Mim Whatley. A quorum was noted.

Consideration was given to the minutes for the regular meeting on July 22, 2026. Councilman Fuhrman made a motion to accept the minutes as presented. Councilman Robinson seconded. Unanimous consent was given. The minutes were accepted as presented.

Reports

Planning

Planning Commission Chairman, Doug Fuhrman, reported that the Planning Commission had only one item on their agenda last week which was the platting of our Arts District. It was approved. Fuhrman also reported that the PC had a training session before the meeting last week.

Senior Planner, Darrell Rigsby, also reported that the PC has the first of a few training sessions before the meeting last week and will have some future sessions also.

Old Business

There was no old business.

New Business

The first item of new business was **Resolution 028-2026 Rebuild Alabama Transportation Plan-FY2027**. Town Engineer, Brad Flowers, noted that this resolution is a required step included in the legislative act and it is done on an annual basis. Councilwoman Bradsher made a motion to approve **Resolution 028-2026 Rebuild Alabama Transportation Plan-FY2027**. Councilman Steindorff seconded. The vote was unanimous, without a vote by Mayor Stone. The resolution was approved. (**Resolution-028-2026**)

The last item of new business was **Ordinance 2026-_____ Annexation of 501 Timberland Road**. The owner was in attendance for possible questions from the council. This was considered the first reading of the ordinance, and it will be on the agenda at the next regularly scheduled meeting.

Other Business

Legal counsel, Mark Williams, noted to the council that he had an update for the council on litigation or potential litigation that warranted an Executive Session. It would also include an item that dealt with

preliminary negotiations involving competitive matters of trade and commerce. Councilman Steindorff made a motion to go into Executive Session. Councilman Robinson seconded. The roll call vote was all yeas. The council left for Executive Session at 6:12PM with an estimate to return in 20 minutes. The council returned at 6:45PM and the mayor brought the meeting back into order.

Mayor Stone congratulated the Pike Road School System on a great beginning of the school year.

With no further business at hand, Councilman Steindorff made a motion to adjourn at 6:46 PM. Councilman Fuhrman seconded the motion. Unanimous consent was given. The meeting was adjourned.
