

Minutes of Pike Road Town Council Regular Meeting
Monday, September 14, 2026|6:00 PM

Mayor Stone called the meeting to order at 6:01 PM. Councilman Fuhrman opened the meeting in prayer. Mayor Stone led the Pledge of Allegiance. Mayor Stone also asked that the council be in prayer for the Bradsher family in the loss of a loved one.

Roll Call: Council members present were Angie Bradsher, Doug Fuhrman, Rob Steindorff, Marcus Robinson, and Mim Whatley. A quorum was noted.

Consideration was given to the minutes for the regular meeting on August 26, 2026. Councilwoman Bradsher made a motion to accept the minutes as presented. Councilman Fuhrman seconded. Unanimous consent was given. The minutes were accepted as presented.

Reports

Planning

Planning Commission Chairman, Doug Fuhrman, reported that the Planning Commission had no items on their agenda last week. Fuhrman also reported that the PC had the second training session after the meeting last week.

Planning Director, Keith Covington, also reported that the PC had its second training session after the meeting last week and has one more to go. He also noted that they are finishing the diagnostic portion of the Unified Code Development and are making progress.

Mayor Stone announced that Dr. Bill Cornwell has completed his term on the Planning Commission. Stone also thanked Dr. Cornwell for his service of many years on the PC. Stone then announced that Andrew Gerachis has been chosen to fill the empty seat and will begin his service at the October PC meeting.

Old Business

There was no old business.

New Business

The first item of new business was **Resolution 030-2026 Bid Award-Hunter Trail Paving Project**. Town Engineer, Brad Flowers, noted that we had three bidders and that A&C Construction was the lowest bidder and asked the council to award the bid to them. Councilman Robinson made a motion to approve **Resolution 030-2026 Bid Award-Hunter Trail Paving Project**. Councilman Steindorff seconded. The vote was unanimous, without a vote by Mayor Stone. The resolution was approved. (**Resolution-030-2026**)

The last item of new business was **Ordinance 2026-_____ Amending BL Ordinance 2012-0266**. Mayor Stone noted that this was in response to action by the Alabama Legislature that would require us to make an amendment. Revenue Officer, Sherri Eason, gave an overview to the council of the changes included. This was considered the first reading of the ordinance and will be on the agenda at the next meeting.

Other Business

Mayor Stone shared with the council a letter from MCSO that gave an in-depth overview of the services that they provide to the citizens of the Town of Pike Road. Councilwoman Whatley asked if we have a contract in place with the MCSO. Mayor Stone noted that there is not currently. It is not customary practice among inter-governmental agencies.

Councilwoman Bradsher asked for an update from Town Engineer, Brad Flowers, on the status of some repairs/issues in Stone Park. Flowers noted that he had been out and reviewed all the issues that the HOA had presented to him. Most of the issues were at personal driveways and not the responsibility of the Town. He did note there were two sections with structural issues and the maintenance contractor, who just returned from two weeks of Jury Duty, would be going out and getting these items repaired as soon as possible along with an asphalt patch. There was discussion about residents cutting into the curb to place a drainpipe, most of which were done without a permit or permission. Bradsher also noted a resident had complained about lighting and trash in Rolling Hills neighborhood along with some speeding issues in other neighborhoods which she directed them to call the Sheriff's Department.

Councilwoman Whatley then asked for the use of Discretionary Funds to sponsor the Jackson Hospital Foundation-Swinging Fore Healthcare Golf Tournament. Her motion was to approve the use of discretionary funds, in the amount of \$1500 to be a sponsor. Councilwoman Bradsher seconded her motion. The vote was unanimous without a vote by Mayor Stone. The funds were approved for disbursement.

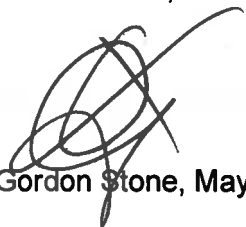
